F.2 PERIOD OF CONTRACT, 52.211-9200 (F500) (JUN 1996).

The contract period of performance is effective from the date of contract award and shall continue, as described below, unless sooner terminated under the terms of this contract. The period of performance for this contract is eighty-four (84) months, consisting of seven, twelve-month contract years.

F.3 PLACE OF PERFORMANCE, 52.211-9201 (F501) (JUN 1996).

The contractor may be required to perform work associated with task orders (TOs) in any of the 50 states. In addition, the contractor may be required to perform work in all countries in which U.S. Government Departments and Agencies have a presence. Services under this contract shall be performed at the locations specified in the individual TOs.

F.4 DELIVERY SCHEDULE FOR REPORTS AND OTHER DELIVERABLES, 52.211-9103 (F5XX) (FEB 1998) (FAR 11.401(a) and 15.204-2(f)).

The work and services required under this contract shall be completed and delivered to in accordance with the Contract Data Requirements List, DD Form 1423 or specified within the delivery schedules of individual task order statements of work (SOWs).

F.5 TASK ORDERS (TOs) PERFORMANCE PERIOD AND PRICING, 52.216-9203 (F504) MAR 2001).

a. TOs may be issued during any of the contract years. The performance period for each TO will be specified in the TO and may extend beyond expiration date of this contract.

b. TOs shall be priced using the Section B rates that will be applicable to the TO's anticipated period of performance. For purposes of task orders issued during the final year of this contract (or any subsequent 6-month option for continued service), the final contract year's pricing shall be used. This means that during basic proposal preparation and award, it is understood that pricing for task orders issued during the last contract year reflects the possibility of continuation beyond the end of the contract period.
